Completing the Life Stressors Section

The National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention (National Center) added the Life Stressors, Section 17, in the release of version 5.1 of National Fatality Review-Case Reporting System (NFR-CRS).

The National Center added these questions so fatality review teams can begin to identify additional risk and protective factors surrounding a death. These factors could have occurred directly to the child, happened a caregiver, and/or were present in the environment. In the NFR-CRS Version 5.1 Data Dictionary, the introduction to Section 17. Life Stressors says:

Children can be impacted by environmental stressors even when they are unaware of them. Please indicate all stressors that were present for this child and family around the time of death. Please elaborate in the narrative section O1 if any of these stressors directly contributed to the child's death.

The National Center recognizes that some of these variables can be subjective and hard to capture. However, it is important to identify these incidences of structural inequity that disproportionally impact certain populations.

This document is intended to inform fatality review coordinators and teams with options for how to complete the Life Stressors Section

As a reminder, there does not need to be clear documentation to support teams' decision about a Life Stressor. It is also important to remember that each team member brings implicit bias into the team meeting which impacts the discussion. It is vital that the team have a method for identifying and discussing bias. The following options are examples of strategies teams have found useful for discussing and capturing Life Stressors in their team meetings.





Option 1:

Team coordinator proposes applicable life stressors to the team during the case review discussion. This requires the team coordinator to have reviewed the case before the discussion and identified potential life stressors. During the discussion, the team coordinator would identify any additional life stressors and ask the team to weigh in on the selection.



Team members select the life stressors they think are applicable during the review discussion. This could be done by photocopying the life stressors section of NFR-CRS paper form. Additionally, the team coordinator could create a virtual survey to collect the information. After the meeting, results would need to be tabulated.

Option 3:

The team can discuss all potential life stressors during the review meeting and document the appropriate ones.

As a reminder, only section I7a., **social/economic stressors**, will appear for stillbirths and infants; for children one year and older, this section is divided into **social/economic stressors** (I7a); **relationship stressors** (I7b); **school-related stressors** (I7c); **technology-related stressors** (I7d); **life transitions** (I7e); and **trauma** (I7f). This document lays out related variables from other parts of the NFR-CRS that can inform team discussions about the life stressors. For section I7a, relevant FIMR-only variables are identified in addition to variables from the whole of the NFR-CRS.
