

The National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention collects information on accidental drowning deaths in the National Fatality Review Case Reporting System (CRS).

Data

From 2004 to 2017 there have been over 5,400 accidental drowning deaths to children under age 18 years old reviewed and entered in the CRS by participating teams.¹

Demographics




For every **10** accidental drowning deaths, **7** were boys and **3** were girls




58% of children who died were under 5 years old



21% were non-Hispanic Black, an overrepresentation in the population



Location of Incident




52% Child's, relatives', or friends' home

41% didn't have Supervision, but it was needed




62% of Supervisors were Parents

Accidental Drowning Sources



49% occurred in a pool, hot tub, or spa



33% occurred in an open body of water²



11% occurred in a bathtub

10 to 17 years old

Most likely to have drowned in open water (68%)
