

Q&A from Webinar: Review of Infant Deaths due to Congenital Anomalies February 19, 2020

- 1. After a fetal demise at 20 weeks how long should a woman wait to try to conceive again?
 - a. (Dr. Gibson): After a loss in the first trimester I usually recommend waiting for the next period. At 20 weeks, I usually recommend waiting 3-6 months. If the patient has a medical co-morbidity that may have contributed to the loss (ex. poorly controlled diabetes), then I recommend waiting longer until that comorbidity is well controlled.
